TROPHIES: Due to trophies not being returned in time and some being returned in poor condition and unable to be presented on the day we have regretfully taken the decision that the championship trophies will no longer be able to be taken home by the winners. This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

This year's show will be held at:

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse and pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) and Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

JUDGING COMMENCES AT 10 AM in Ring 1.

RING 1 Judge: Mr M Doherty, Glasgow

Class 1 Best Turned Out Horse - in hand.

Class 2 Cob - In Hand - any age.

Class 3 Coloured - Traditional / Native - In Hand - any age.

Class 4 Coloured - Sports / Plaited - In Hand - any age.

Class 5 Veteran Horse / Pony (16 years or over) - In Hand.

Class 6 Sports Horse - In Hand - any age.

Class 7 Ex Racehorse - In Hand. Raced or been in training - any age.

Class 8 Any other type/breed of Horse/Pony - In Hand (Arab, Friesian, Palomino, etc) - any age.

IN HAND HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP - To be judged from 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 2 - 8.

Class 9 Best Turned Out Horse - Ridden - four years old or over.

Class 10 Cob - Ridden - four years old or over.

SINGLETONS SHATTON SOPHIE MEMORIAL TROPHY for best cob from winners of Classes 2 & 10.

Class 11 Coloured - Traditional / Native - Ridden - four years old or over.

Class 12 Coloured - Sports / Plaited - Ridden - four years old or over.

THE ODDBALL SALVER for Best Coloured from winners of Classes 3, 4, 11 and 12.

Class 13 Veteran Horse / Pony (16 years or over) - Ridden - four years old or over.

Class 14 Sports Horse - Ridden - four years old or over.

Class 15 Ex Racehorse - Ridden. Raced or been in training. Four years old or over.

Class 16 Any other type / breed of Horse / Pony (Arab, Friesian, Palomino, etc) - ridden. Four years old or over.

Class 17 Riding Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over - ridden.

Class 18 'Lightweight' Hunter, mare or gelding - ridden, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying 79.5 kg (12 stone 7 lb) and under. Small Hunters to be included in this category.

Class 19 'Heavyweight' Hunter, mare or gelding - ridden, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying over 79.5 kg (12 stone 7 lb).

RIDDEN HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP - To be judged from 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 10 - 19.

RING 1 CHAMPIONSHIP - To be judged from 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 2 - 8 & 10 - 19.

CO-OPERATIVE TROPHY

JUDGING COMMENCES AT 10 AM in Ring 2.

RING 2 Judge: Mrs R Eastwood, Stranraer

Class 20 Brood Mare with foal at foot or having a foal in 2026 - to be shown in hand.

Class 21 Foal - to be shown in hand.

Class 22 Yearling colt, filly or gelding - to be shown in hand.

Class 23 2 year old colt, filly or gelding - to be shown in hand.

Class 24 3 year old colt, filly or gelding - to be shown in hand.

CKHDT TROPHY for best yearling, two or three year old in classes 22 - 24.

Class 25 Best Turned Out Pony / M&M - in hand.

Class 26 Mountain and Moorland Small Breeds - Any age - to be shown in hand. (*Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and B, Eriskay.*)

- Class 27 Mountain & Moorland Large Breeds** - Any age - to be shown in hand. (*Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C & D.*)
- Class 28 Show Pony / Show Hunter Pony** - Any age - to be shown in hand.
- Class 29 Young Handler - Child 11 years and under.** To be shown in hand. Pony will require to be led correctly and presented to judge in halt, walk and trot. Conformation and type of pony is not taken into account, although the pony must be suitable in size and temperament for the handler. **Prizes for all entrants.**
- Class 30 Young Handler - Child 12 - 16 years old.** To be shown in hand. Pony will require to be led correctly and presented to judge in halt, walk and trot. Conformation and type of pony is not taken into account, although the pony must be suitable in size and temperament for the handler. **Prizes for all entrants.**

IN HAND PONY CHAMPIONSHIP

To be judged from 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 20 - 24 & 26 - 30.

- Class 31 Best Turned Out Pony / M&M** - ridden.
- Class 32 Ridden Ring Experience - Ponies.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Walk and trot only. Snaffle bit, no spurs or whips. Class is for ponies / riders that genuinely seek ring experience with no canter go round or in the individual show. Combinations in this class may only enter additional In Hand or Best Turned out classes.
- Class 33 Ridden Ring Experience - Horses.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Walk and trot only. Snaffle bit, no spurs or whips. Class is for horses / riders that genuinely seek ring experience with no canter go round or in the individual show. Combinations in this class may only enter additional In Hand or Best Turned out classes.
- Class 34 Lead Rein Pony** - mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128 cm (12.2 hh). Rider 10 years and under. Snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to noseband only.
- Class 35 First Ridden Pony** - mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128 cm. Rider 12 years and under. Snaffle bridle.
- Class 36 Mountain and Moorland Small Breeds** - to be shown ridden. (*Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and B, Eriskay.*)
- Class 37 Mountain & Moorland Large Breeds** - to be shown ridden. (*Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C & D.*)

TERREGLES STUD TROPHY for Best Shetland (Standard or Miniature) (Classes 26 & 36).

- Class 38 Ridden Show Pony** - mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Class will be split if sufficient entries (not exceeding 138 cm (13.2 hh) / not exceeding 148 cm (14.2hh).
- Class 39 Ridden Show Hunter Pony** - mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Class will be split if sufficient entries (not exceeding 133 cm (13 hh) / not exceeding 153 cm (15 hh).

RIDDEN PONY CHAMPIONSHIP - To be judged from 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 32 - 39.

EMMA McMIKEN TROPHY FOR BEST SHOW AND SHOW HUNTER PONY

To be judged from winners of classes 28, 34, 35, 38 and 39.

RING 2 CHAMPIONSHIP - BILL WHITEHALL TROPHY

To be judged from 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 20 -24, 26 -30 and 32 - 39.

CKHDT TROPHY FOR BEST TURNED OUT - To be judged from 1st in classes 1, 9, 25 and 31.

SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP - Champion and Reserve from Rings 1 and 2.

PERPETUAL TROPHY - THE DR JOHN CALVERT MEMORIAL TROPHY

Classes may clash and we will try to accommodate as far as possible.
Please advise collecting ring steward on the day if there is a potential issue.
Do NOT muck out horseboxes on site. Take droppings and rubbish home.
Dogs must be kept on a lead and any poop scooped and binned. Thank you.

The winners of Best Turned Out classes are not included
in the judging of championship classes.

General Rules

1. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, amalgamate and divide classes where necessary to facilitate the running of the event.
2. No refunds will be given, except at the discretion of the organisers.
3. **The Judge's decision will be final.**
4. **INSURANCE:** It is mandatory for anyone attending this event to have public liability (3rd party) insurance. By entering you confirm that you hold appropriate public liability insurance.
5. **Anyone aged 17 years or under** must be accompanied by an adult who takes full responsibility for their welfare and actions at all times while on site.
6. Only those named at time of entry may ride or exhibit horses / ponies at the Show.
7. **It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that when mounted they are wearing a hard hat conforming to current British Riding Clubs rules.**
8. Anyone using a mobile phone in the ring will be asked to leave immediately.
9. **Horses and Ponies must only be ridden at walk outwith warm-up or rings.** Organisers will request the immediate removal of any animal not under control. Stallions or colts must not be led or ridden by anyone under the age of 14. Stallions must be identified by a red, white and blue ribbon in the tail.
10. The ages of horses will be calculated from 1st January in the year in which they were foaled. **All horses and ponies shown under saddle to be four years old or over.**
11. All ponies shown in the Mountain and Moorland classes must be shown in accordance with the breed society's regulations. The M&M classes are open to registered and non-registered animals. Spurs must not be worn in M&M classes.
12. Exhibitors are required to withdraw from a class if the Judge has an interest in his/her exhibit (owned, trained, kept at livery, ridden in competition, financial interest or similar).
13. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. Please scoop the poop.
14. Put rubbish in bins provided and take away horse droppings from the parking area.
15. Do NOT muck out horseboxes on site. Take droppings home. Thank you.
16. Any objections against the awards of the Judges (which on the merits of each exhibit shall be final - see Rule 3), or in regard to any matter connected with the Show, must be lodged in writing, with the Secretary, not later than 12 noon on the day following the Show. Each protest must be accompanied by a deposit of £25, and if not upheld the sum deposited may, at the discretion of the Committee, be forfeited to the Club. All decisions of the Committee shall be final in determining the outcome.
